Kia ora e te whānau

Tāmaki Makaurau/Auckland moved to Alert Level 2 at 6am 7 March, Sunday morning and the rest of the country moved to Alert Level 1. Covid-19 hasn't gone, so we still need to be careful and follow the Government's guidelines.

In Level 2 we must:

- Ensure information is provided to tāngata in a way that suits their needs
- Keep using QR Codes and tracing our whereabouts, a reminder to whānau to keep up your contact tracing when tāngata are with you
- Continue to regularly wash your hands, cough and sneeze into your elbow and wipe down shared surfaces
- Keep 2 metres distance in public and wear a face covering in places where keeping 2 metres distance is difficult. E.g. supermarkets, crowded areas
- Whānau need to make an appointment to visit the whare, as we are still playing it safe – the same applies to anyone visiting the whare

Vaccines

We have been asked a lot of questions about Covid vaccines, when are they coming, how will we get them, are they free, what will happen if I don't want to have the vaccine? The Pandemic Team is working to get the answers to these questions. We will get the information out to you as soon as we can.
