<b>Visitor Screening – for ALL offices and where</b>	NZ COVID Tracer app, NZ Pass Verifier (My Vaccine Pass) and screening questions installed on Whare tablets. Te Roopu Taurima visitor screening log book to be utilised. Manuhiri are encouraged to ring ahead and book to ensure there is no crossover between whānau groups of manuhiri including contractors.					
<b>Visitors</b>	<p>If manuhiri is fully vaccinated and answers NO to all screening questions – indoors and outdoors.</p> <p>If manuhiri is unvaccinated or answers YES to any screening questions – outdoors only.</p>	<p>If manuhiri is fully vaccinated and answers NO to all screening questions – can meet indoors but in a designated area with minimal contact with others.</p> <p>If manuhiri is unvaccinated or answers YES to any screening questions – outdoors only – one family at a time.</p>	<p>If manuhiri is fully vaccinated and answers NO to all screening questions – outdoors only – one family at a time.</p> <p>If manuhiri is unvaccinated or answers YES to any screening questions – outdoors only – one family member at a time.</p>	<p>If manuhiri is fully vaccinated and answers NO to all screening questions – outdoors only – one family member at a time.</p> <p>If manuhiri is unvaccinated or answers YES to any screening questions – visit may be declined and arrangements made for online contact or to meet at an external venue.</p>		
<i>When available, Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT) will be an additional protection measure that will be used as surveillance testing.</i>						
<b>Community Outings</b>	These can go ahead	<p>Vaccine Passes to be used in the community for vaccinated tāngata at all settings.</p> <p>All Kaimahi must carry their vaccine passes and Te Roopu Taurima ID when out in the community while on shift.</p> <p>Mask wearing and social distancing to be followed as much as possible. If Vaccine Passes are not used outings will be restricted as defined by the Covid Protection Framework.</p>				
<b>Precautions for community outings under all settings:</b>						
<b>Home to Whānau</b>	Tāngata can go on an overnight visit regardless of their vaccination status, however, an approved Home Leave form must be completed prior to departure. As part of the risk assessment process, discussion will happen with whānau around the requirement for undertaking screening upon tangata returning to the whare including the possibility of requiring a negative Covid test upon return. Unvaccinated tāngata will be required to produce a negative test result upon return.				Use of technology to connect will be encouraged as much as possible. Compassionate visits may occur with the risk assessment. Unvaccinated tāngata will be required to produce a negative test result upon return.	
<b>New Referrals</b>	Negative COVID-19 test within 72 hours. Risk assessment on a case-by-case basis; requires approval from Service Manager.					
<b>Hospital Admissions (Returning home from Hospital Stay)</b>	Negative test pre-discharge; follow DHB advice.					
<b>Employment (if tangata are employed)</b>	Can work following employer's public health measures.			Cannot work, unless essential worker and following risk assessment based on PWS health risk factors.		
<b>Infection Control (where protocols are required to manage an infection)</b>	Masks for kaimahi and visitors.			Masks, aprons and gloves for kaimahi and visitors; follow PPE guidance. One-metre social distancing where possible.		Outbreak kit utilised. Full PPE, including N95 masks and gowns, for kaimahi and PWS. One-metre social distancing where possible.
<b>Transport</b>	Keep to agreed number of people, wear masks, and reduce numbers in vans/keep social distance between passengers, clean van before/after use. Vehicle booking system to be used for pool cars to plan ahead for cleaning if required.
