It is my privilege, as the newly appointed Chair, to present this foreword reflecting on the 2024–2025 year ending June 2025. Having stepped into the role in December 2024, it was immediately evident that the groundwork laid by those before me had already positioned Te Roopu Taurima on a strong and purposeful trajectory. Over the past year, our organisation has continued to evolve, strengthening the foundations that will sustain us for the next 25 years and beyond.

Like many community-based organisations, Te Roopu Taurima has navigated significant shifts in the political and funding landscape over the past year. While these changes have presented challenges, they have also prompted us to strengthen our service delivery, invest in our kaimahi, and refine our systems. Our commitment remains steadfast: to provide a kaupapa Māori service that is tika and pono, grounded in our values. Enhancements to our processes, training, and digital capability have been essential steps toward this goal, and we will continue to build on these improvements in the coming year.

A significant milestone during this period was the relocation of our Ōtāhuhu office to our new premises in Penrose in November 2024, an achievement was made possible through the dedication of our CEO and the wider team, supported by external partners who ensured a timely and cost-effective transition.

The move brought with it a renewed sense of vibrancy and connection. Throughout the year, our tāngata and their whānau embraced opportunities to come together for regular celebrations and cultural events.

Witnessing tāngata take the lead in Matariki, Te Matatini activities, mihi whakatau for new kaimahi, and our Christmas festivities has been truly inspiring. These moments exemplified tino rangatiratanga in action and reminded us of the purpose that anchors our mahi.

As we look ahead and prepare to recruit new board members for 25/26 in the governance space, we do so with deep gratitude for those who have shaped our organisation's journey.

We acknowledge, in particular, the contributions of our former Deputy Chair Whaea Merepeka Raukawa Tait who concluded 10 years of dedicated service. Her wisdom, leadership, and unwavering has left an enduring legacy. E te Whaea, e te puna kōrero, kua roa koe e ū ana ki te waka o Te Roopu Taurima. Kua whakapaua ō kaha, ō pukenga, me tō ngākau pono ki te arataki, ki te tautoko, ki te hāpai i o tātou kaupapa.

Our tāngata and kaimahi in our regions also had collective opportunity to celebrate Matariki and our anniversary milestone. The annual Matariki Ball is always highlight, bringing together more than 200 tāngata, whānau, and kaimahi. It was a beautiful reminder of the joy, unity, and aroha that underpin our mahi alongside our tikanga that provides more opportunities for our tāngata to come together.

Our relationships continue to extend beyond Aotearoa. This year, we once again hosted a delegation from Osaka Metropolitan University in Japan, creating a meaningful exchange of culture, knowledge, and practice and waiata.

Closer to home, strengthening our partnership with whānau remained a key priority creating more regular opportunities for connection, contribution and shared understandings in both online and hui settings, and opportunities and I thank our whānau and wider community for their continued participation and kōrero.

Innovation and improvement has also been central to our progress this year. The launch of Ako Zone, our new Learning Management System, represents a major step forward in how we support kaimahi development. Keeping pace with technology and tools to enhance our mahi remains a focus to support how we resource, and support the delivery of our services to our tāngata so that they may continue to live their best lives.

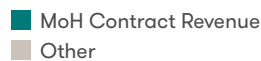

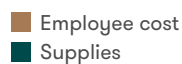
Breakdown of Revenue
